Letter H - Lesson 17 (see Saxon) Review the alphabet strip. Teacher will model the /h/ sound and how to write Hh.. Teacher will introduce sight word "oh" and discuss how the word does not follow the rules. These words are called sight words because they are irregular. Show students the irregular word book as an example. If desired, make copy for students. Worksheet as a class. Students will code the words his, hop, hits, hill, hip, and hid as a class. As a class, teacher will model with students how to spell sand, hip, past, lift, and list

Students will do the back of the page (referred to as homework) independently. Students will code the Letter G - Lesson 18 (See Saxon) - Review alphabet strip by marching every time a letter is said. Teacher will model the /g/ sound and how to write Gg. Teacher will introduce the apostrophe s and what it means. Use letter tiles for spelling. Worksheet as a class. Students will code the words tag, hag, got, zig, gift, and flag as a class. As a class, teacher will model with students how to spell hog, tags, hot, go, and gift. Students will do the back of the page (referred to as homework) independently. Students will code the words go, sag, fig, pig, gill, and snag. Students will also spell pig, gas, and flag

Letter R - Lesson 19 (See Saxon) Review alphabet strip with a ball game (see Saxon). Teacher will model the /r/ sound. Model how to write Rr. Use letter tiles for spelling. Worksheet as a class. Students will code the words rat, rid, trot, grit, razz, and drill as a class. As a class, teacher will model with students how to spell got, gift, snag, and rip. Students will do the back of the page (referred to as homework) independently. Students will code the words rag, rid, rot, trip, raft, and rap. Students will also spell selected words. Teacher can choose 4 words if needed.
